## The Miss Firecracker Contest - About the Playwright

**Beth Henley (Playwright)** is an American playwright of regional dramas set in provincial Southern towns, the best know of which, *Crimes of the Heart*, was awarded a Pulitzer Prize in 1981. Henley, a graduate of southern Methodist University, University Park, Texas, turned from acting to writing as a career because she felt that the theatre offered few good comtemporary roles for Southern women. Her first play, the one -act *Am I Blue*, was produced while she was sitll an undergraduate. *Crimes of the Heart*, her first full-lenght play, was produced in Louisville, Kentucky, in 1979 and in New York City in 1980.

Henley's later plays include the two-act *The Miss Firecracker Contest,* 1979, in which a small-town woman of dubious reputation attempts to gain respect by winning a beauty contest; *The Wake of Jamey Foster,* 1983, which centres on a family grieving over the death of the alcoholic title character; *The Lucky Spot,* 1986,; *Abundance,* 1991, a revisionist western about mail-order brides in the Wyoming Territory; *Control Freaks,* 1992; and *The Jacksonian,* 2013, which is set in a Jackson, Mississippi motel in 1964 and revolves around a murder. Henley also wrote television scripts and screenplays.


